Who better to represent the spirit of music than Kokopelli, as he plays the flute while embraced by the thread-work Treble Clef sign, created in a very Southwestern turquoise color?

In the vast majority of music, the melody is written in the Treble Clef, and the notes dance below, between and above the five lines in the staff. Here, we chose to allow the five lines to define the separations between the foreground, four layers of rock and the beautiful blue sky. And if you look carefully at the next to the top layer of rock, you will find the images of the dancers etched in stone, as they are in so many historic sites in the Southwest.

The coyote, proudly wearing his handsome scarf, is responding with his own unique musical composition.

And the Mariachi musician apparently stashed his marvelously decorated hat on the top of the Clef.
